THE RULES

- Create a single city council district or create a full-four district plan.
- New districts should have a population of around 9,000-9,500.
- The largest district should be no more than 900 people greater than the smallest district.

ABOUT THE BLOCKS

Each of these blocks are drawn within the city's existing neighborhoods. The numbers represent how many people are in each block based on the final 2020 census data adjusted by the state of California and are rounded up or down.

HOW TO DRAW

Please draw four districts that are generally equal in population, do not split blocks, and are contiguous.


